






Kaffe's Trip Around the World —98" × 98"

I used all Kaffe Fassett fabrics for this quilt. It has 4,225 pieces.


I did the machine quilting.












Kaffe's Cabin—97" × 97"


This is made from the Scrappy Mountain Majesty pattern by Bonnie Hunter and is free on the Quiltville website. The blocks are easy to make but there is a lot of matching when putting rows together. It measures 71" × 59" and was machine quilted by Kristin Hoftyzer. The fabrics are a fat quarter bundle of Downton Abbey fabrics. It is intended for a friend who retired before a few years ago. She should be able to binge watch shows like Downton Abbey but she stays very busy helping out with her 11 grandchildren.



I used a Kaffe Fassett jelly roll and the background fabric for the quilt top. Sarah Yoder Parker quilted it beautifully using a basket weave pattern that worked with the top design and really popped on the Minke backing!







The pink project bag was made in a class at Cotton Creek Mill in West Branch. The pattern was *Project Bags 2.0* by <u>annie.com</u> It was fun to do and I plan to do a couple more sizes. I'm sure the next two will go more quickly than the first!
