Kristin Summerwill 'Welsh Quilts'

Before Welsh quilts were "rediscovered" as national treasures, collectors would often find them relegated to dogs' beds, covering farm vehicles, or stowed away in barns as "heavy old things." Mary Jenkins and Clare Claridge in their book, <u>Making Welsh Quilts</u>, call them the "Cinderella" quilts, literally having been left out in the cold and now exhibited in museums.

Welsh quilts are known by their quilting designs....dense, decorative and often incorporating paisley patterns, leaves and other natural designs, hearts, and most recognizably, the spiral. Martha Waterman cites, "the spiral is the most characteristic of Welsh quilt patterns, and with its echoes back to ancient rock carvings in North Wales, the spiral is the signature of the Welsh quilt."

Meredith Sewell Workshop: Hand-Quilting Welsh Quilts

OCQG member Meredith Sewell brings her experience in hand-quilting to the decorative designs of traditional Welsh Quilts. This hands-on workshop incorporates quilting on whole cloth rather than on pieced fabric. Full Kits will be provided including: materials to construct a 36 x 36 inch 'sandwich' of cotton sateen solid fabric front, 'wadding,' as the Welsh would refer to batting, and a patterned fabric backing, quilting needle and thread. Meredith will provide Welsh style quilting patterns in leaves, paisley, spirals and hearts, for you to use to design your own quilting layout. You can also innovate with a layout of your own designs. In Welsh quilting there are no set quilt patterns or designs that everyone follows, and the quilting norm is only 3-4 stitches to the inch due to the heavy nature of the wadding. It's wide open for innovation!

The Workshop fee is \$25.

Presidents' Patch

Pam Ehrhardt & Vicki Walch, co-presidents

An interesting interaction occurred following last month's guild meeting. The program included eleven newcomers to the guild who agreed to introduce themselves and show a few of their quilts. These quilts were then displayed on a side table so others might take a closer look at the close of the program. As it happened, several of the newcomers joined other guild members looking at the quilts and interesting discussions resulted. Techniques were explained and questions answered. At another table one of the newcomers had brought the pattern for her quilt and was explaining to 4 or 5 onlookers the steps she took to make her quilt.

This kind of sharing and interacting with other quilters is what many of us joined the guild for - to learn and to be inspired by others. Each month's Show and Tell is one of the highlights of our meetings but can there be other avenues of sharing we are missing out on? Have you ever seen a quilt during Show and Tell that you would love to see the quilting up close or know more about, like what was the pattern or how did they do that special border?

There is little chance you will find that out. unless you seek out that quilter after the meeting and ask, otherwise the opportunity is lost.

What if quilts from Show and Tell are put on display for others to examine after the meeting? Their owners could be available to answer questions and explain techniques. If a pattern or technique was new to you, it will probably be of interest to others.

So as your co-presidents, we would like to try something new. Beginning with our January guild meeting, members who Show and Tell quilts may place them on display on side tables and be available to answer questions of others following the meeting.

Melanie McNeil had the right idea when she wrote in the January 2018 President's Patch: "Share yourself and your skills with the quilters around you. It will enrich your experiences with the guild, and it will make the guild better and stronger. Show your heart. Share yourself. Have courage."

March 9, 2020 Marianne Fons lecture "Read My Latest Quilt!"

Few names are as well known in quilting today as Marianne Fons. Marianne is a teacher, author, magazine publisher, and co-creator of the television show "Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting." With Liz Porter, she

authored Quilter's Complete Guide, one of the best selling quilting books of all time, published in 1993, reprinted in 2019 by Dover Publications. Marianne Fons and Liz Porter were the 2019 inductees into the Quilters Hall of Fame in Marion, IN.

Marianne served on the board of directors of Quilts of Valor Foundation for many years. She helped

establish the Iowa Quilt Museum in 2016, and in 2017 reopened the Iowa Theater, both in her hometown of Winterset, Iowa. Currently she is pursuing a new career as a novelist.

Join us as longtime quiltmaker and literature lover Marianne Fons debuts a new lecture in which she shares visuals of quilts from the past (and present) that have something important to say. She'll examine ways in which quilters have delivered written messages via their quilts and compare her decades-long career in patchwork with her new career as a hopefully-soon-to-be-published novelist.

QUILTER'S SERVICE SEW DAY FEBRUARY 10, 2020

Come to Service Sew Day on February 10

Each year the guild hosts a day of sewing to make guilts and other projects for donations to various organizations in the community. The church will be open for set up at 11:30 am at Redeemer and we will continue working until 8:00 pm. Everyone is welcome to come at any time that suits them and stay as long as they like— 1-2 hours or all day!

For many of us this is a favorite activity of the Guild's year. It's a chance to get to know other members better while also producing quilts and other items that are valued by those who receive our donations.

Bring your sewing machine, scissors, thread, and pins. The guild will provide ironing boards, extension cords, power strips, large cutting mats, rotary cutters, and large rulers, but having your own set of tools would be a help.

The Service Committee has assembled many pre-cut quilt kits with full instructions for members to complete. In many cases, the blocks are already cut and pieced so your work can focus on sashing and borders. It's all designed so that we can make as many guilts as possible in a short amount of time. We will also have burp cloths to be stitched.

If you don't want to bring your sewing machine, we'll have opportunities to contribute in other ways. There will be guilts that need the binding hand stitched, so bring a needle for that (the thread will be provided). You could also iron completed tops or arrange the tops, batting, and backing fabrics into quilt sandwiches.

We will definitely have something for you to do!!

Bring your own lunch if you haven't already eaten before you come. Everyone is also encouraged to bring snacks to share as the day goes on.

Since we will be staying through the evening meal, we'll be organizing a soup and salad supper. We'll have a sign-up sheet at the January meeting to volunteer to bring specific items. The Program Committee wisely put the leftover cookies from our December meeting in the freezer, so we'll have plenty of those on hand for snacking and dessert.

May 12, 2020 Workshop "Moths & Moons"


