Have you ever wanted to make a Mystery Quilt? Are you looking for projects to thin out your stash? Have you always wanted to make a quilt kit for Service Day, but didn't know how to go about it? Join us for this fun opportunity as we provide directions and tips from September 2020 through February 2021 to make a fun quilt top. You choose the fabrics and the block size to create the quilt of your choosing.

WHAT: The MBOM (Mystery Block of the Month) directions will be distributed to participants over 5 months (September-January), with instructions for the specified number of blocks to sew that month. In February, participants will receive directions to assemble their quilt either at Service Day or individually. Our goal is to prepare as many quilts as possible to donate to the organizations supported by the OCQG.

WHEN: An introductory ZOOM meeting will be held in August to explain the process, discuss materials needed, and to answer questions. This information will also be emailed to each participant. Each month participants will be directed to complete a different set of blocks. We will offer different formats to be able to share the blocks completed each month.

WHERE: The blocks for the quilt top can be made in the comfort of your own home. They can then be assembled at our annual Service Day or individually in February.

WHY: To provide quilt tops and quilt kits for Service Day that will be distributed to the various organizations supported by the OCQG.


