Catherine Redford Sept 10 & 11, 2018

Our OCQG schedule starts anew with Catherine's evening presentation, "Lessons Learned While Quilting," which she describes as "My life as a quilter not always serious, but definitely informative - a fun time of quilts and inspiration."

Catherine will also hold a <u>9-4pm Tuesday Workshop</u>, "Hand Stitching for Quilters," which includes embroidery and big stitch quilting. The fee for her Workshop is \$25, plus a Kit for \$25 which includes a printed cotton sampler, needles, hand dyed thread and stitch sheet for the embroidery class AND low loft batting, needle and threads to practice big bold hand stitching in the afternoon. Sewing machines will not be necessary. At this time, there is room for four additional individuals in this workshop.

Catherine Redford moved from London, England to Naperville, Illinois in 1995. In 1998 she discovered quilting, began taking classes, then later teaching classes, and now teaches and speaks to Guilds around the country. She is an author of quilting books and a contributor to quilting magazines.





She describes her style as "eclectic" and is best known for her originality and innovation in the methods she uses to complete her projects, particularly in the realm of embellishment and free-motion quilting. Her diverse interests in world folk art design and embellishment, modern quilt design, and personalized machine quilting - plus any combination of the three - makes her style unique. She encourages her students to try all the processes involved in finishing a quilt.



The Value of Your Guild Membership

Do you ever wonder what your membership fee pays for? Here's what you get with your guild membership:

- Eleven programs a year, including national speakers as well as talented local and regional teachers.
- Eleven newsletters a year with information about programs and workshops, committee reports, and announcements of upcoming events.
- Facebook news of guild and local events, including sales announcements from our advertisers.
- Opportunities to share quilts and projects, whether completed, in-process, or antique.
- Fellowship with other quilters.
- Access to our library, which holds more than 300 items you can check out.
- Access to workshops with our speakers, giving you hands-on opportunities for fun and learning.
- Access to two retreats a year.
- Free entry of quilts into our triennial quilt shows.
- Support for guild donations of quilts and other items to local service agencies.

At only \$25 per member, fees don't pay for all the guild's expenses. In fact, it isn't even enough to cover programs! Why are programs so expensive? Each speaker charges a fee, typically from \$200-\$400, plus their travel expenses. Between mileage, hotel, and meals, travel expenses often exceed the speaking fee.

To cover the cost of meeting space, programs, service projects, and other costs, the guild also depends on fund-raisers. Time-intensive raffles and auctions help keep our treasury healthy. If we covered all expenses (excluding retreats and workshops) with membership fees instead, the fee per person would be \$30 or \$35.

When you write your membership check this year, consider adding a \$5 or \$10 donation. Every dollar helps support the quality programming you enjoy, and the fellowship with other quilters to teach and inspire you.


