

Have you ever checked out a book from the library? Did you know there are over 300 pattern books and a few novels with a quilting theme available to you each Guild meeting?

HAVE FUN SEWING A MYSTERY MEDALLION QUILT

Since the July 2018 Guild Challenge is a medallion quilt, we chose that as our mystery quilt. The basic design is no mystery, however, for all medallion quilts require a center block surrounded by multiple borders.

The finished quilt measures 42" x 42", so would qualify for the guild challenge. The design is fairly easy with lots of half square triangles. It would look great scrappy. The quilt pattern will be given in six installments over 6 months. Instructions for each part will be posted on the OCQG website on the second Monday of each month. It can be found at Programs/ Services>>Mystery Quilt (http://ocqg.org/mystery-quilt.html). The first installment is already posted. Printed copies of the instructions will also be available at Guild meetings for those members without access to the web.

QUILTS AND GARDENS GO TOGETHER

The pairing of gardens and quilts seems natural - the use of color, contrast, textures and patterns. Project Green has asked the OCQG if some of its members might be willing to display their quilts in gardens on the 2018 Project Green Garden Tour. It will be Project Green's 50th Anniversary, so the organizers wanted to add something special to the 2018 Garden Tour held Saturday, June 23rd.

When the project was proposed to the membership at the November guild meeting, 25 members signed up indicating an interest in this collaboration between OCQG and Project Green.

The idea of displaying quilts in gardens during a tour has been done successfully in other communities. Efforts are made to match the quilts with a particular garden including its location in the garden. Information about the quilts are shared with visitors. Volunteers are available to safeguard the quilts during the tour. Quilts should be wall hanging size or smaller, not bed size.

Tech Committee Plans

At the November meeting, Tech Committee members Adele Monserud, Sandi Irvine, and Vicki Walch, reported on their plans for the next several months.

Advances in communications technologies have led to a myriad of changes in how people create, share, document, and archive information. In light of this, OCQG has a newly-formed Technology Committee whose purpose is to find and develop ways to facilitate the collection and sharing of guild information. As you might imagine, the possibilities are many and we're hoping for outcomes that will "speak to" guild members' diverse interests and enhance the participation of members of our quilting community.

To this end, we're working on several technology efforts that will streamline information sharing. We are:

Scanning documents that have been collected since the inception of guild in order to digitize these historical records for archival purposes.

Developing a web site in which guild members and others can access current and past information about our guild. We are currently:

- preparing to transfer our web site to a different platform that will allow us better ease of uploading information
- looking for options to "pay on line" for membership, dues, donations, etc.
- finding ways for committees to store up-to-date information and reports online so they can easily share it with each other and future committee members

Establishing a Facebook page as a way to access and advertise guild information and important events.

Launching an Instagram account to share Show-and-Tell and workshop photos. (Instagram is a social networking app made for sharing photos and videos from a smartphone.)

Considering other tech-related activities such as creating a small group interested in learning how to use the new Electric Quilt 8 software.

That being said, we know that there is a wide range of comfort and expertise in using technology among our members. So, we are planning a series of technology training sessions to help you understand what is available to you through the technologies we are incorporating. Some of these will be quick 5-10 minute demonstrations at meetings, and some will involve 20-30 minute training sessions starting at 6:30 before meetings. **We want you to feel completely free to use and access the technology we are developing in whatever way works best for you.**
